**DESIGN CLASS (Flowers may be from any source)**

1. 'Voices of Spring' --a triangular design featuring spring flowers
2. 'Raindrop' --a miniature design
3. 'Puddles' --a design showing water

**CULTURAL CLASS (Name variety when possible)**

1. African Violet (Saintpaulia) – one crown
2. Daffodil (Narcissus), trumpet/large cup, one scape
3. Daffodil (Narcissus), small cup, one scape
4. Daffodil (Narcissus), double/split cup, one scape
5. Daffodil (Narcissus), A.O.C.
6. Branch of shrub or tree, no longer than 75cm (30 in)
7. Grape Hyacinth (Muscari spp.), one stem
8. Houseplant grown for foliage, one pot
9. Houseplant - flowering (except African Violet or Orchid), one pot
10. Hyacinth (Hyacinthus), one stem
11. Orchid in bloom – may be potted
12. Tulip (Tulipa spp.), wild species (include tarda, praestans, greigii, A.O.C.), one stem
13. A bowl of small spring flowers
14. \*Any flowering bulb/corm not listed, one stem
15. \*Any garden flower not listed, one stem
16. Seedlings, any flowering plant, 4-pack, please name variety
17. Seedlings, vegetable and herbs, any variety, 4-pack, please name variety and herbs

**MAY PROGRAMME**

**Date:** Monday, May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2019

**DESIGN CLASS (Flowers may be of any class)**

1. 'Fireworks' -- a colourful vertical design
2. 'Summer's Promise' -- a design using flowers/foilage to show a Hogarth curve
3. 'One Fine May Morning' -- a design using just one flower or flower head and foliage and /or filler

**CULTURAL CLASS (Name variety when possible)**

1. Bleeding Heart (*Dicentra spectabilis*), one stem
2. Daffodil (*Narcissus*), one scape
3. Flowering branch of shrub or tree, no longer than 75 cm (30 in)
4. ForgetMeNots (*myosotis alpestris*), three stems
5. Hosta, 3 leaves any variety/ies same or mixed
6. Houseplant grown for foliage, one pot
7. Houseplant – flowering, one pot
8. Iris, one stem
9. Lily of the Valley (*Convallaria majalis*), three stems, one leaf
10. Pansy (*Viola*), with own foliage, three stems, any colour/colours
11. Peony, one bloom
12. Tulip (Tulipa), single, one stem
13. Tulip (Tulipa), double, one stem
14. Tulip \*Tulipa), Parrot, one stem
15. Tulip, A.O.C., one stem
16. #Any flowering bulb/corm not listed, one stem – named
17. \* Any other small flower, not listed (single flower, flower cone or flower cluster not more than 5cm in any direction), one stem 00 named
18. \* Any other large flower, not listed (single flower, flower cone or flower cluster over 5 cm), one stem 00 named
19. Rhubarb, three stalks, leaves clipped in a 2.5" fan above stalk
20. Seedlings, any flowering plant, 4 seedlings, please name variety
21. Seedlings, vegetable and herbs, same variety, 4 seedlings, please name variety and herbs

**JUNE PROGRAMME**

**Date: Monday, June 24th, 2019**

**DESIGN CLASS**

1. 'By the Light of the Silvery Moon' -- a crescent design
2. 'Pearls of Wisdom' --an oriental design of your own creation
3. 'Marches On' --a parallel design [don't forget the Thyme]

**CULTURAL CLASS (Name variety when possible)**

1. Allium, seed head, one stem
  2. Allium, large head (greater than 5 cm), one stem.
  3. Allium, small head, three stems
  4. Canterbury Bells (*Campanula calycanthemata*), one stem
  5. Perennial Cornflower (*Centaurea Montana*), one stem
  6. Clematis, one bloom
  7. Columbine (*Aquilegia*) one stem
  8. Coreopsis, one stem
  9. Pinks (*Dianthus*), three stems/sprays
  10. Flowering branch of any shrub or tree, one, no longer than 75 cm (30in)
  11. Foxglove (*Digitalis*) one spike/stem
  12. Hosta, any variety(ies), three leaves, same or mixed
  13. Iris, one stalk
  14. Larkspur, one stem
  15. Lupin, one spike
  16. Peony, single, one bloom
  17. Peony, double, one bloom
  18. Peony, any other variety, one bloom
  19. Poppy, Oriental, one bloom
  20. Rose, Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora, one stem
  21. Rose, Floribunda/Polyanthus one stem/spray
  22. Rose, any other variety, one stem/spray
  23. Sweet William, one stem
  24. Any other flowering bulb, corm not listed, 1 stem, named
  25. \*Any other small flower not listed, (single flower, flower cone, or flower cluster not more than 5 cm in any direction), one stem, named.
  26. \*Any other large flower not listed, (single flower, flower cone or flower cluster over 5 cm), one stem, named
  27. Lettuce, one plant
  28. \*Any fruit tree
  29. \*Any vegetable, three small, one large

**SEPTEMBER**

**Date: Monday, September 23rd, 2019**

**DESIGN CLASS**

1. 'Rainbow' a small design featuring pastel coloured Queen Anne's Lace---[pick the Queen Anne's Lace about 3-5 days before the show, scrape or split the stems and put them in various colours of food colouring – stems will absorb the coloured water and colour the flower heads.]
2. Harvest Home---a design using flowers and at least 2 categories --fruit, vegetables, and /or herbs.
3. 'Ghost' a miniature as Halloween'en approaches

**CULTURAL CLASS**

1. Anemone, Japanese, one stem
2. Aster (*Callistephus chinensis*) annual, single or double, one stem
3. Aster, Michaelmas daisy, one stem
4. Calendula, one stem
5. Chrysanthemum (*Dendranthema*), one spray
6. Clematis, one bloom
7. Coreopsis (*calliopsis-tickseed*), one spray
8. Dahlia, cactus, one bloom
9. Dahlia, decorative, one bloom
10. Dahlia, any other variety, one bloom
11. Coneflower (*Echinacea*), one stem
12. Gallardia, one stem, no leaves required
13. Ornamental Grasses, 3 stems of one or more cultivars
14. Marigold (*Tagetes*), single, three stems, any colour(s)
15. Marigold (*Tagetes*), double, over 7.5 cm, one stem, any colour(s)
16. Marigold (*Tagetes*), double, any size, three stems, any colour(s)
17. Nasturtium, three stems, include foliage
18. Pansy (*Viola*) with attached foliage, three stems
19. Petunia, one stem
20. Rose, one stem/spray
21. Rudbeckia (*Gloriosa Daisy*), one stem.
22. Sedum, one stem
23. Snapdragon (*Antirrhinum*), three spikes
24. Sunflower, one stem
25. Zinnia, one stem

**SEPTEMBER PROGRAMME (cont'd.)**

26. Any vine, one no longer than 75 cm (30in)
27. \*Any other flower grown from bulb/corm/tuber, one stem, named
28. \*Any other annual, not listed, one stalk/stem/spike, named
29. \*Any other perennial, not listed, one stem, spike, spray, named
30. Branch of any shrub or tree with berries, no longer than 75cm (30 in)
31. Branch of any shrub or tree showing fall colour no longer than 75 cm (30 in)
32. Onions, three bulbs
33. Peppers, one (any variety/varieties)
34. Potatoes, three tubers (if possible, name variety/varieties)
35. Tomato, regular variety, ripe, one fruit with stem
36. Tomatoes, small ripe, one stem/spray
37. \*Any vegetable not listed, one large or three small
38. Herb Collection, 3 or more different varieties, named
39. Gourd Collection, 3 or more varieties, large – one of each, small or three of each
