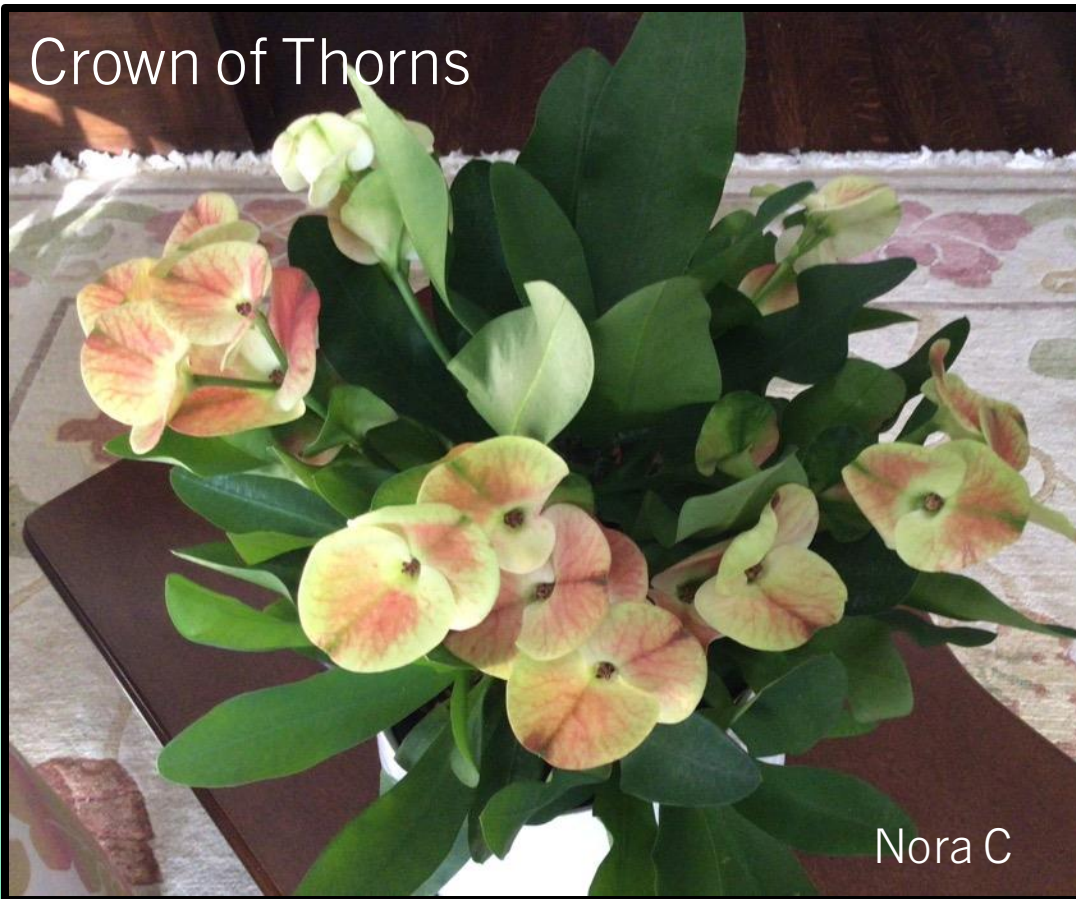

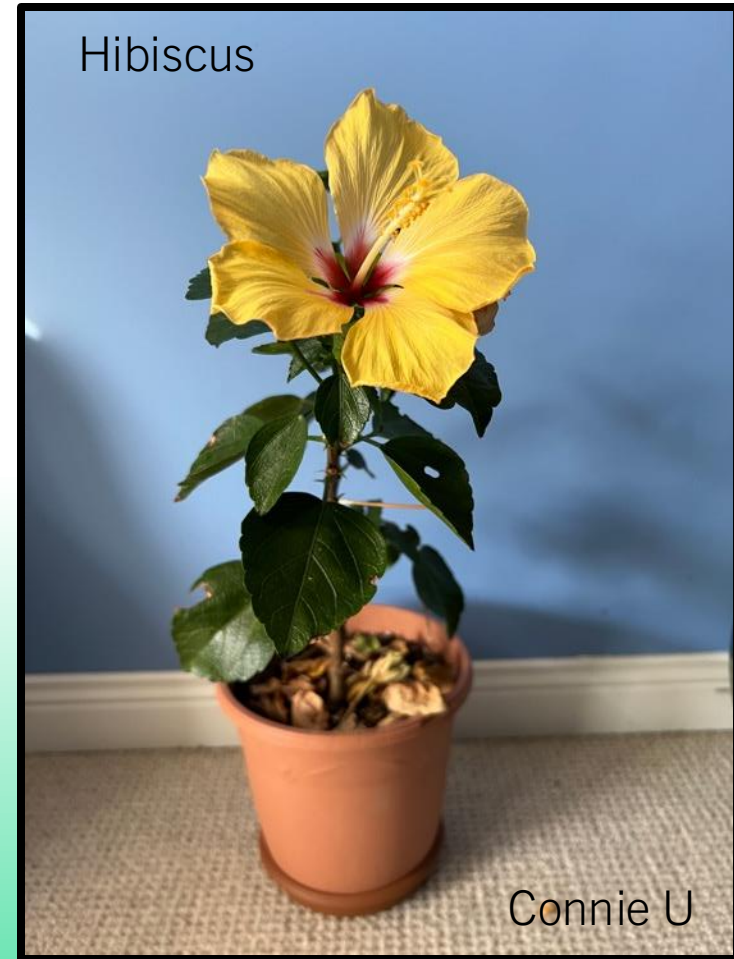

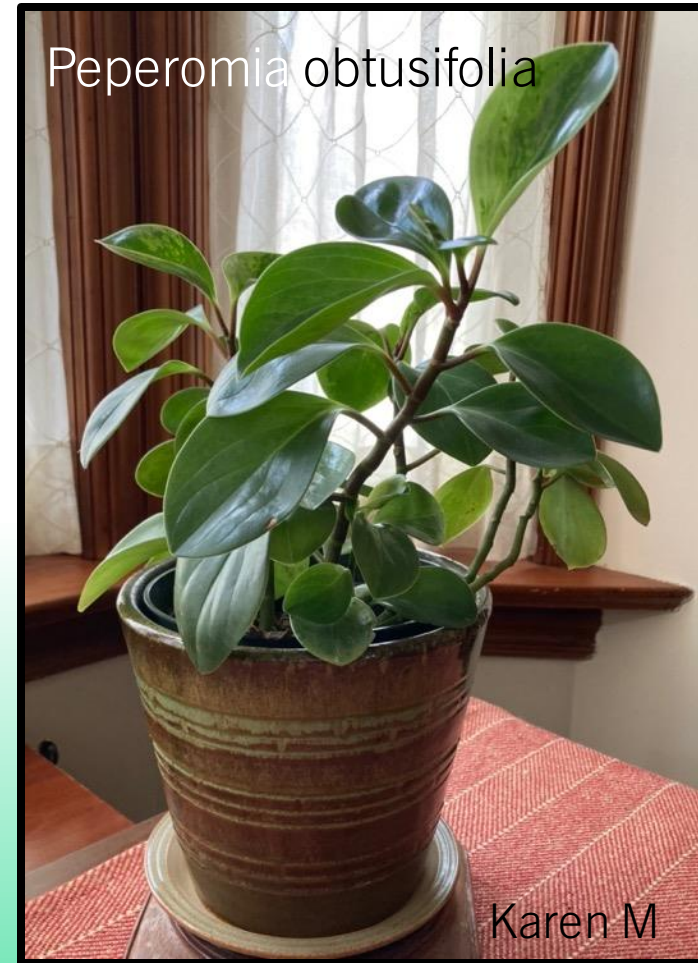
Kathy Martin presents this interesting plant

## CLASS 3. FOLIAGE PLANT



*What is the difference between a Pothos and a Philodendron?*

- Both belong to the aroid family
- Both have heart-shaped leaves
- Both have aggressive aerial roots
- Pothos leaves are thicker & waxier
- Pothos grow one arial root/node vs several roots/nodes in Philodendron
- Base of Pathos' leaf is straight
- Base of philodendron is curved toward top of heart.

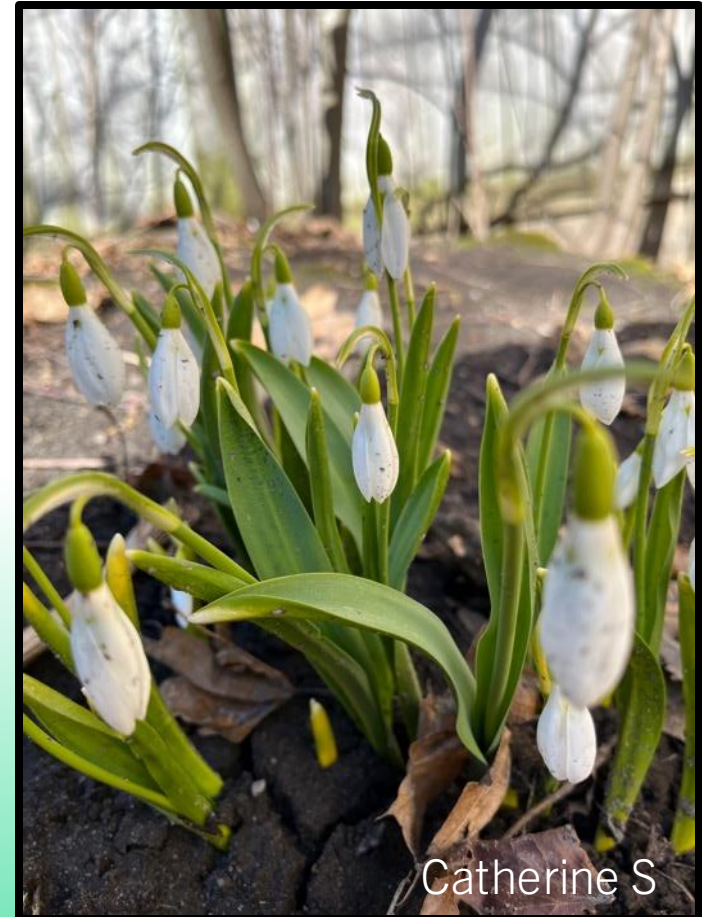
