## Sprucedale & District Honticultural Society



#### **BOTANICAL SKINCARE, DISTILLATION & PLANT MEDICINE**



May's meeting on the 20th, took a side trip to Sprucedale Community Centre and showcased Ashley Love as the guest speaker.

She is the owner of Lovenorth.ca a locally owned skincare and aromatherapy product company. With extensive training in Western Herbal Medicine focusing on North American Plants and living for 2 years in the forest, she has gained practical and hands on knowledge to compliment her formal studies.

In 2012 she started her business, ethically harvesting botanicals and evergreens to create her natural skin care and aromatherapy products. Her goal is to be able to educate the public of the properties of natural plants while producing products made in Canada.

Ashley brought with her a portable copper still where she uses the ancient alchemical process of hydrosol distillation.

On her website she describes her process as "Promotes ethically wild-harvests an array of botanicals & evergreens, and using the ancient alchemical process of distillation, we work hand in hand with Mother Earth to create distillations, which come out in the form hydrosols (water soluble extraction of the plants) and essential oils (oil soluble extraction of the plants). Hydrosol Distillation: The steam (vapour) moves into a condenser – an area cooled by water. The steam condenses, returning to its liquid forms. The liquids are collected. The essential oil rises to the top or sinks to the bottom and is extracted.



These extracted materials are used in the creation of her line of skincare and aromatherapy products.

Her line of products, to name a few, include facial mists, facial serums, face cream, face masks, steams, bath salt, body butters, lip balms and herbal salves. She also has a selection of herbal teas from ethically sourced natural local plants.

In addition to the distillation presentation, Ashley gave us an overview of Chaga Mushrooms, how to harvest them ethically as well as their medicinal uses. She has developed a chaga powder which is created using a different extractor and is now included in her product line. Those attending the presentation were able to sample some of her products too.

What a fantastic turn out to our Annual Plant sale held on May 18th at Hope's Clover Farm in Novar.


Thanks to those who brought their plants to the sale as well as to those who helped out pricing and selling the great selection of annuals and perrenials.
