

Speaker: Marian Jean

Topic: Dahlias: History to Storage

Marian discovered the incredible variety of Dahlias seven years ago when looking for 'Jessie G' as a gift for her mother, Jessie Giles. This began the obsession which created Oakridge Dahlias. Oakridge now grows over 900 dahlias annually, about 500 varieties, on her property south of Peterborough.

Marian has offered to bring tubers for Wyn's Desert Sunrise Dahlias for members to plant in their gardens and enter in the special competition in the August and September flower shows. We look forward to seeing some fantastic results.

The Beaverton Horticulture Society meeting in March drew a record attendance to hear the very informative presentation by Gini Sage and Karen Durnin, Durham Master Gardeners. Gini provided an overview of the different types of hydrangea (arborescens, paniculata,


