**HORTICULTURAL CLASSES**  
***DIVISION I***

**Section A - Spring Bulbs**

**Class**

**Note:** Classes 1-4 are standard traditional tulips not fancy varieties, not more than 2 leaves

- 1 a) Tulip, single, red, including those with a yellow centre, one bloom  
b) Tulip, single, pink or rose, one bloom  
c) Tulip, Liberation 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary, one bloom
- 2 Tulip, single, coral, peach, orange, one bloom
- 3 Tulip, single, mauve, purple, black, one bloom
- 4 Tulip, single, white, cream, one bloom  
a) Tulip, yellow, one bloom
- 5 Tulip, same colour, three blooms
- 6 Tulip, multi-flowered, one stem
- 7 Tulip, lily flowered, any colour, one bloom
- 8 Tulip, fringed, any colour, one bloom
- 9 Tulip, double or "peony" any colour, one bloom
- 10 Tulip, bi-colour, single, any colour, not fringed, one bloom
- 11 Tulip, any other not listed e.g., parrot, viridiflora, etc., one bloom
- 12 Tulip collection, five to seven blooms, variety of colour

**Note:** Daffodil and Narcissus are terms which are interchangeable. Do not remove spathe i.e. leaf like beige, papery bract at the base of the flowers

- 13a Daffodil, trumpet, one bloom (see Exhibiting Notes)
- 13b Daffodil, long cup, one bloom (see Exhibiting Notes)
- 14a Daffodil or narcissus, semi double, one stem
- 14b Daffodil or narcissus, double, one stem
- 15 Narcissus, short cup, one bloom (see Exhibiting Notes)
- 16 Narcissus, multi-flowered, one stem
- 17 Narcissus poeticus, one stem (see Exhibiting Notes)
- 18 Narcissus miniature, single or multi-flowered, one stem
- 19 Daffodil collection, variety of five to seven stems (one or more blooms per stem)
- 20 Muscari (Grape hyacinth), three stems
- 21a Flowering bulb, one stem, hyacinth
- 21b Flowering bulb, one stem, frittilaria
- 21c Flowering bulb, one stem, any other

**Section B - Other Garden Flowers**

**Class**

**Note:** All stems to be measured from the table to the highest point on the stem

- 22 Any flower - three stems, over 12" (30 cm)
- 23 Any flower - three stems, under 12" (30 cm)
- 24 Any spring flowering shrub/tree/vine, not more than 18" (45 cm), one spray
- 25 Lilac one stem (truss) not more than 24" (60 cm)
- 26 Any spring flowering shrub/tree/vine, not more than 30" (75 cm), one spray
- 27 Bleeding Heart, one stem, any colour
- 28 Solomon Seal, three stems not more than 36" (91.5 cm)
- 29 Collection of three kinds of garden flowers, two specimens of each cultivar/variety of species not already listed (in same container)

- 30 Iris, self (solid colour), one stem
- 31 Iris, bi-colour, one stem
- 32 Iris, bi-tone, (standards significantly lighter shade than falls but the same colour) one stem
- 33 Lily of the valley, three stems, with leaves (not necessarily attached)
- 34 Viola or Pansies, five stems, foliage not necessary

### **Section C - Spring Vegetables**

#### **Class**

- 35 Asparagus, three stalks, 6-8" long and as uniform as possible
- 36 Rhubarb, three stalks, bottom not cut, leaves trimmed to 2" fan shape
- 37 Spring onions, three specimens, trim roots to 1/2", tops trimmed to 6-8" above white

### **Section D – House Plants**

#### **Class**

- 38 African violet, double bloom, single crown, any colour
- 39 African violet, single bloom, single crown, any colour
- 40 Any hanging or trailing plant
- 41 Any foliage houseplant, not already listed, named if possible
- 42 Any flowering houseplant, not already listed, named if possible
- 43 Fern
- 44 Succulent (including cactus), one plant, named if possible
- 45 Collection of house plants, two or more in one container
- 46 Trough/container garden, 3 or more plants, not more than 16" (see Exhibiting Notes)

### **Section E - Design classes**

**Theme** – *YEAR OF CELEBRATION – Spring Celebrations*

#### **Class**

- 47 The Queen's Birthday: A centrepiece design with candle(s)
- 48 Liberation Celebration: Interpretive design
- 49 All Hearts Day: Satellite design
- 50 Arbour Day, celebrating the environment: Foliage design
- 51 Happy Easter: A design in a basket
- Novice**
- 52 May Day: A spring design
- 53 Rainy Day Sunday: A design showing water

### **Section F - Open class**

#### **Class**

- 54 Have fun with your collection of leftovers in a vase! Voting by members will determine the People's Choice Award.

### **Design Descriptions**

**CENTREPIECE DESIGN:** A design low enough for people seated at a table to see each other.

**INTERPRETIVE DESIGN:** A design where a given theme, idea, occasion, mood, atmosphere, etc. is suggested by the selection and organization of the design elements.

**SATELLITE DESIGN:** A design with a main unit and a smaller unit of the same colour, form and/or

texture which do not touch each other but have a connective line between the units that becomes a vital part of the rhythmic pattern of the design.

FOLIAGE DESIGN: A design in which foliage predominates (flowers or fruit, if attached, must be inconspicuous).

**EXHIBITING NOTES:**

TRUMPET DAFFODIL: The trumpet or corona is as long or longer than the surrounding petals.

LARGE-CUPPED DAFFODIL: The cup or corona is more than 1/3 but less than equal to the length of the surrounding petals.

SMALL-CUPPED DAFFODIL: Not more than 1/3 the size of the surrounding petals.

HOUSE PLANTS: Container grown plants should be exhibited in the container they are growing in and should have been grown by the exhibitor for at least three months. Inconspicuous staking is allowed and plants will be viewed for judging from all sides.

TROUGH/CONTAINER GARDEN: A miniature garden designed to reproduce a natural ecosystem. The container frames and gives the garden its characteristic landscape shape.
