## Some Past and Current Projects Include

**Beamsville District Secondary School** - donation of a greenhouse and continued support; annual student bursary; garden project for school's 125th anniversary

**Niagara College** - endowed bursary set up in 2009; plus \$2K annual grant for its horticulture program

**Design, plant, continued partial maintenance of our gardens at the following locations:**

» **Balls Falls Conservation Area** - two perennial and one pollinator gardens

» **Town of Lincoln** - gardens on municipal grounds, annual spring clean-up

» **Dutch-Canadian Friendship Tulip Garden** at the Millennium Forest

» **Mt Osborne Cemetery** - rhodos & azaleas garden

» **MF Rittenhouse Library** - side garden

» **VRIC Grounds** - rhodos & azaleas; landscape plan including plant list; annual spring clean-up

**Millennium Forest** - 135 kinds of trees planted to commemorate Year 2000. Victoria Ave., north of the QEW

**Niagara Parks** - grants to School of Horticulture (e.g. \$2K in 2021); financial donations to the Legacy Garden, perennial borders, purchase of special conifers, etc

**Others** - annual donation of prizes for floral competition at West Niagara Fair; planting of mature trees and bulbs in various locations; gardening publication subscriptions for the library; community awareness and outreach events
