EXTENDING THE LIFE OF CUT FLOWERS



1. Cut the bottom of the stems before you put the flowers in the vase. An angled cut is best as this will enable the flower to draw more water.

2. Add a fertilizer to the water. Most flowers shops include a pouch with the order. Follow the directions carefully. Don't use too much.

3. Make sure the vase is high enough to support the flowers. Too much strain on the stems will cause the flowers to die sooner.

4. After a couple of days re snip the stems. This will add an additional day or two to the life of the flower.

5. Flowers last longer is you put them is the fridge (in water) overnight. That's why florists store cut flowers in a cool room

6.Watch the water level and top up as required. Older cut flowers will die quickly when starved of water, even for just a couple of hours.
