I'm a PhD candidate at the university of Ottawa in the department of Biology (I did my undergrad at the university of Toronto specializing in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology). My research explores the consequences of warming and drying climates on wild bee and wasp populations. I conduct field work both in Colorado Rockies, but also locally in Toronto and in Ottawa where I'm currently running a citizen science-driven study exploring the impacts of urban heat island effect on city-dwelling bees and wasps. In the past I've enjoyed giving talks for various groups including the Ottawa-Carleton Master Gardeners, the Gloucester Horticultural Society, the Barrhaven Garden Club, Almonte Field Naturalists and the Ottawa Quakers. I've also enjoyed giving guided public hikes and running outdoor youth programs in both Toronto and in Ottawa.
