This 2-acre property and home started to come to life in September 1996 considering there were no perennial beds or a single flower at all anywhere. All work on the property has been envisioned and installed by the homeowners. A lock stone path, patio area and a fish pond were first installed – no fish now as the Cormorants were quite busy assisting in the removal of the fish every year. The soil is heavy rock-filled clay and it's a miracle that the perennials planted anywhere on the property actually thrive. The design of the perennial beds follows the flow of the house and deck. The large 12x12 gazebo was built in 2018 to complement the pool and deck layout. You can follow the path of the beds to discover the continuity of perennials and some hidden treasures. The most recent project completed in 2022 is a new bonfire area with surrounding beds all built around the bird feeders and bird bath.
