
Guest Speaker: David Hawke

Topic: Selective Flora of Simcoe County



David Hawke is a naturalist who is well known for his outdoor writing and photography. David has worked for several agencies and organizations around Lake Simcoe. In his weekly blog, he shares his observations and insights related to our local natural environment

Over the years David has worked as a naturalist and wildlife technician at the Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre, and the Tiny Marsh Provincial Wildlife Area. He has also been employed as an eco-tourism manager for several resorts in central Ontario; most recently he was with the Couchiching Conservancy Land Trust, as their Stewardship Manager and Ecologist, looking after 51 properties (totaling 14,000 acres) spread across the Lake Simcoe watershed.

Hummingbird trivia and Hummingbird facts:

- -While many of us are familiar with the ruby-throated hummingbird, there are over 300 species of hummers.
- -These are smart birds. Their brain-to-body ratio is the largest of all birds.
- -Hummingbirds flap their wings 50-200 times per minute.
- -Pulling up from dives, hummingbirds pull almost 10g's.
- -Their heartbeat is 1,200 per minute.
- -While hummingbirds' diet consists largely of nectar, they also consume tree sap, pollen, and insects. Among the insects they eat are mosquitoes.
- -Speaking of diet, hummingbirds consume 2 times their weight per day.
- -They need to feed every 10 minutes. That's why they are such frequent visitors to your feeder.
- -Hummers remember every flower in their territory and how long it takes to get there.
- -Their lifespan is 3-12 years.
- -Hummingbird eggs are about the size of a jelly bean. There will be 1-3 eggs in the nest.
- -It takes 15-18 days for the eggs to hatch.
- -At rest, hummingbirds breathe 250 times per minute.
- -Hummingbirds have weak feet and are not good at walking.
