Hi Everyone

Another gardening season has been "put to bed".

Mother Nature gave us some extra time to get our gardens cleaned up this year. The delayed hard frost also resulted in some surprises in my garden.

I have a beauty berry bush that is a zone 5 shrub. It grows okay here, but I've never seen it at its full maturity, with petite lilac-coloured berry clusters covering the stems. The frost has always shut the plant down before the berries ripened. This year however, the berries had a chance to ripen, and the bush was lovely. I also have a Japanese Forest Grass which has done well in its spot for a number of years. Last week I noticed delicate seed heads on the plant – likely given a chance to develop due to the delayed frost. While the effects of global warming are catastrophic, there are a few small things that might pleasantly surprise us.

Our last meeting of 2023 is next week. We will be holding our Annual General Meeting, and as is customary, it will begin with a turkey dinner. We will also have a winter floral arrangement demonstration by **Marietta Jones**, owner of Fiori Row in Perth. It will be a busy evening! Details further on in this newsletter.
