President's Report

In November 2022, the planters were cleaned out and the seasonal vegetation installed by many wonderful volunteers of the EAHS. Poppies were placed on each planter in honour of the soldiers who have fought for our freedom. The Legion Board of Directors and many people in the community were very touched. Poppies were removed after November 11th and the planters took on their seasonal appearance. The Legion expressed their sincere appreciation for acknowledgment of our soldiers.

Also in November, we had our AGM, at which a new board of directors was elected and installed. Connie Matthews-Cull received the President's Award from outgoing copresident Frances O'Malley. Since there was a spike in Covid in November, the board of directors unanimously cancelled the Christmas Party.

December was still very exciting as the EAHS won Best Float Overall in the Rotary Santa Claus Parade and Food Drive (and also a prize in last year's parade) which was very good for our profile and our hearts. Several volunteers enjoyed this process and product, lead by Lynn Risto. The \$75 dollars won was donated to Hospice Renfrew.

In January we started the year with a board meeting. Our speakers line-up this year was stimulating and encouraged very large audiences to join us (usually between 50 and 60 attendees were at each Members' Meeting. When one of our scheduled speakers was taken ill unexpectedly just before his presentation, the board of directors managed to pull together an engaging Trivia Night that was met by laughter and comradery.

In February and March, several artists in our district painted birdhouses, including five representing EAHS. These were sold at an on-line auction in March in support of the OHA Convention. Our artists commanded the highest bids. In addition, Genevieve Townsend decorated a bird feeder, which was donated by Connie Matthews-Cull, with images of wild flowers etched in pyro graphics and it was sold at the Silent Auction at the OHA conference in July. EAHS was asked to contribute to fundraisers held by the OHA to finance the conference, and some of us were very generous in purchases of plants from the rare plant auction, peonies, and T-shirt sales, rock painting, and in volunteering our time to contribute to the success of the conference. Connie Matthews-Cull donated 4 dozen jars of assorted jams sold at Anne Harbord's table which raised over \$800 at the Conference, and she delivered a talk about "Invasive Plants in Our Gardens" to a receptive audience. One EAHS member donated cash which was much appreciated by the organizers of the Conference. Val Collins, our choice for the Garden Hero of 2022, donated many, many, many hours of her time at the conference organizing speakers and she contributed to a wonderful event hosted by District 2. We also had a few members from EAHS who attended the Conference as volunteers. It should be noted that one of our members, Judy Grasmuck, named the conference "Rock your

Garden World" as a nod to the Canadian Sheild which pokes out through the top soil in the Ottawa Valley. Judy and her husband Stephan Grasmuck also won many of the classes in the photography competitions.

The EAHS began to hold monthly Floral and Horticultural shows (cut flowers, potted plants, fruit and vegetables) during the monthly meetings. The shows were organized by a director on the board, Michele Parsons, and were offered for the members' enjoyment, to provide a creative outlet, and to encourage interest in horticulture. These exhibitions are essential for horticulturalists to learn from one another and to realize their potential. We are grateful to Michele and to Carmen Shultz who assisted in judging with Michele.

In March, April and May, several members of the EAHS volunteered their time to raise the profile of the EAHS at these events: 1) Seedy Sunday which was organized by Seeds of Creation and sponsored by the National Farmers Union in March. 2) In June, EAHS volunteers manned a booth in the Arena for the first Annual Eganville Expo which showcased businesses, and organizations in Eganville, thereby raising our profile in the community. 3) In addition to these activities, the EAHS was involved in a Seniors' Gardening workshop at the Echo Centre for a three-part workshop beginning in April and ending in June, and lead by Frances O'Malley. Keen EAHS volunteers participated in a workshop to share the pleasure of growing our own food in containers. 4) The EAHS members were also participants in the Hike for Hospice and we raised about \$2700 for Hospice Renfrew.

The EAHS had three very successful fundraisers this year. Sharon Henry organized our Spring Plant sale and the membership did not disappoint in providing beautiful plants. Again, in the fall, Sharon rounded us up and organized another good Harvest Auction and Plant Sale. Terry Hoelke auctioned member donations of canning, vegetables and volunteers brought in many beautiful plants. In addition to these two plant sales, Judy Sauvé and her team organized the Giant Book Fair at the old Firehall which had unparalleled success. These three fundraisers resulted in a little over \$8,000 which was needed to plant the village, and to pay a student to water.

In June, the planters were installed with Joanne Hoelke as planting chair. With the collaboration of our society, Temperate Gardens, the Township of Bonnechere Valley, and our summer student, Layne Jessup, and funded by a Canada Student Jobs Grant, and our fundraising efforts, we enjoyed the planters around the village.

Also in July, our Open Gardens Event began with five participants over two days. We are grateful to Carmen Shultz who organized the participants and took signs to their driveways to direct guests.

We remain a good group of partners in the EAHS, and we enjoyed a very busy and successful year.


