2024 - STARTED WITH A PHRAG(mites)

Our first meeting of the year was held on March 18 at the Emsdale Community Centre. It was certainly a full house with so many new and returning members attending.

We were thrilled to invite Karen Martin and Marilee Koenderink from Near North Enviro Education Centre – NNEECN to learn all about the Invasive Phragmites Australis. Some brave souls even came out in the bitter cold to view phragmites stands growing at the Evergreen Heights Public School driveway.





The presentation was super informative with a hands-on presentation that included photo boards and albums, samples of tools used to eradicate the phragmites such as cane cutters, spade and saw. There were specimens of phragmites stalks with plumes (which have over 2000 seeds) and the very large roots. Invasive Pragmites spreads quickly with 40-60% of the rhizomes up to 10 meters are below the ground. This plant releases toxins from its roots into the soil and can even kill surrounding plants. It does prefer areas of standing water and the roots can grow to very long lengths which allow it to survive even in fairly dry areas.

One of the most important things to remember about any invasive species is PREVENTION. There are 3 main things that we brought back with us which were: 1) Share what you Learn, 2) Map IT and 3) Use Best Practices.

To top it off we also learned all about iNaturalist - https://www.inaturalist.org/. iNaturalist helps you identify the plants and animals around you while generating data for science and conservation.

They also touched briefly about other invasive species such as Japanese Knotweed and others that grow in our areas.
