More about the spring plant sale ...

If you plan to donate plants, now is the time to divide your perennials and pot them up. They need some time in the pot to perk up from the trauma of division. Leaving it to a few days before the sale can result in wilted looking plants. Fear not, once divided, plants really want to grow despite what we do to them. Here are a few plants that sell well, so, if you have any, why not share?

- Natives are much in demand! e.g. bloodroot, mayapples, toad lily, bee balm, black eyed susan, coneflowers, prairie smoke, cup plant, gas plant, ginger
- Astilbes, phlox, hellebores, hardy geraniums, lavender, bluebells, creeping phlox.
- Small or unique hostas
- Japanese forest grass
- Ferns
- Vegetable plants you have started from seed



Please label each plant's name and keep in mind that named varieties sell best.

Remember, we do not sell invasive plants. A few common ones that some of us might have at home, but do not want to spread to others: English ivy, periwinkle (vinca minor), lily of the valley, gout weed and miscanthus. Here are a couple of more links to invasive plants if you are in doubt.

If you don't have a lilac shrub in your garden, consider the short drive to the Royal Botanical Gardens in Hamilton to see the Katie Osborne Lilac Garden which consists of more than 500 lilac varieties.

The RBG website posts "Bloom Watch" info to let you know which different varieties are blooming at which times. The lilacs look beautiful for multiple weeks in May. Dates vary according to weather and season. For example, in 2023, the date of peak bloom was the week of May 17, whereas in 2020 the peak was during the week of May 31.
