Seed Starting Tip:
~ALWAYS SIEVE YOUR SOIL~
Because you want your little
seedling to confront as few
disruptions to their growth as
possible, one way to remove
any obstructions from the
growing medium, is to sieve
your potting soil. This will also
aid seedlings in establishing
strong roots!
