


The Horticultural Association prides itself in guiding and encouraging the Horticultural Societies across Ontario. The projects and initiatives fostered by the OHA and carried out by the dedication of Horticultural Societies continue to beautify our communities and conserve our Ontario environment. The work that Horticultural Societies do in their communities is all volunteer time. In 2013, volunteers from Horticultural Societies in Ontario and those volunteers on the OHA Board together gave over 487,000 hours of volunteer service.

The Ontario Horticultural Association was organized in 1906 as a way of uniting the several autonomous Horticultural Societies in Ontario. Today, with 284 Member Societies, the Ontario Horticultural Association is one of the oldest and one of the largest umbrella organizations in Ontario. Whether working toward planting more trees, sharing knowledge, or beautifying communities, the OHA has remained relevant through all of its 106 years.

A Message from the President of the Ontario Horticultural Association

It was only as President of the Ontario Horticultural Association this past year that I really grasped the scope, imagination and dedication to horticulture voluntarily given by the members of our societies and their District Directors in "Keeping Ontario Beautiful". We are a large volunteer Association with some 27,000 individuals in 284 incorporated societies grouped into nineteen districts spanning all of Ontario.

Each year the societies in one district, guided by its Director, host our annual Convention and General Meeting. For some four hundred people they must find a site with accommodation, space and facilities for meetings, seminars, exhibitions, contests and vendors, and plan local tours. This year it was Thunder Bay, next year it will be



Cornwall. In every case volunteers devote long hours of work over a period of up to three years to make this possible. The key to our success lies in the District Directors who make the link between the Association and the member societies.

Travelling from Martinville to Watford, from Dunnville to Mindemoya on Manitoulin Island and in Thunder Bay, at each stage I was welcomed and was able to see and discuss the projects they were pursuing, such as their plans for community gardens and ornamental gardens in cities, towns and villages. The enthusiastic dedication of society members is infectious and is "Keeping Ontario Beautiful".

OHA 2013 GRANTS

Assistance to Students

The Ontario Horticultural Association gives an annual grant of \$500 to a student in Horticulture at the University of Guelph.

In addition, many Member Societies also give grants or bursaries to local educational institutions for the furthering of horticulture. A survey conducted by the OHA found that Member Societies across Ontario together donate over \$45,000 yearly to further education in horticulture in Ontario. That's quite an impact.

Youth Club Grants for 2013

Youth Club Grants provide Youth Clubs/Groups with financial support. The grant may be applied for by any active Youth Club/Group in Good Standing with the Ontario Horticultural Association. Grants are used for such activities as the purchase of seeds, helping with special events, and general supplies for the Youth Club/Group applying for the grant.

ANNUAL AWARDS TO INDIVIDUALS Presented at the Banquet of the 2013 Convention

Each year Societies are encouraged to recognize horticultural and service excellence by submitting nominations for OHA Awards. A committee reviews all the nominations. The winners are presented with their awards at the Banquet of the Annual Convention. The winners of the OHA awards for 2013 were as follows:

Ancaster Horticultural Society, District 6 and LOTTE BRUNNER of Cloverleaf Garden Club of Mississauga, District 15. Entry in the HONOUR ROLL denotes extended service to a horticultural society and to the district. A certificate is also issued to commemorate the occasion.

SILVER MEDALS were awarded to DIANNE AND GARY WESTLAKE of Peterborough Horticultural Society, District 4. The Ontario Horticultural Association SILVER MEDAL, with its associated framed certificate, is the highest award of the Association. This prestigious award is given in recognition of meritorious service to beautification, conservation or ecological work and/or outstanding leadership in the promotion of horticultural societies across the province.

The YOUTH LEADER AWARD was presented to **KIM OLY** of Cloverleaf Garden Club of Mississauga, District 15. The **YOUTH LEADER PLAQUE** is presented to a person or persons who have been Youth Club leaders for a minimum of five years and have given leadership and encouragement to OHA youth.

KATHERINE ANDRACHUK of Parkdale & Toronto Horticultural Society, District 15, and CECILE YOUNG of Kirkland Lake Horticultural Society, District 12, were presented with TRILLIUM Awards. The TRILLIUM, a silver brooch, is awarded to a lady or ladies for outstanding service to horticultural societies, their District and/or the OHA for an extended period. This award was initiated by Thelma Boucher, OHA President in 1941.

The COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT AWARD was presented to the JOYCE BOCKMASTER of Woodbridge Horticultural and Garden Society, District 15. This plaque is presented to an individual, organization or company which has improved the beauty of the landscape and added to the quality of life to their community through a horticultural project.

AWARDS OF MERIT were presented to MANUELA NETO, Cloverleaf Garden Club of Mississauga, District 15, and BOB WILT of Ancaster Horticultural Society, District 6. This framed certificate is given for notable contributions to the programmes of the Association or a Society. Contributions can include special beautification projects, outstanding work in the science or the art of horticulture, or supporting individuals or organizations in the area of communications, as well as other worthy efforts.






Keeping in touch will all the Member Societies of the Ontario Horticultural Association is one of our greatest challenges. We believe that communicating is important. To that end, the Association issues a quarterly newsletter, The Trillium, and maintains an active and informative web site.

The Trillium

The OHA's quarterly publication, the Trillium, is now being emailed to 500 OHA societies and donors. In addition it is mailed via Canada Post to 120 others.

The distribution of both the electronic and hard

copies is managed by the Trillium editor and a mailing assistant. Each issue is posted prominently on the GardenOntario.org home page. Past issues are archived on the website as well.
