The guidelines draw on the information sources listed below to provide help schedule writers, show organizers, exhibitors and judges respond to the COVID-19 pandemic

If the virtual Flower Show is to be judged, organizers are encouraged to select someone from the OHA Judges List on the OHA website Shows tab

These guidelines may also be useful in organizing other types of virtual competitions such as Photography, Arts or Youth

Judging criteria for these other types of competitions are not covered in OJES (2019) so Show organizers should make an effort to find other qualified judges

Schedules for OHA Convention competitions - Photography, Art, Creative Writing, Publications, Youth - typically include a scale of points for judging

The OHA Judging Committee has also just produced more detailed Photography Judging Guidelines (January 2021) presented below

Hence our interest in having virtual shows given on-going COVID-19 constraints on getting together in person

Even after COVID-19, virtual shows or shows with virtual class(es) may continue to be valuable to enable a broader range of participants and eliminating the need to travel

 The OHA Judging Committee released these guidelines because as OHA Certified Judges in Horticulture and Floral Design, we are sometimes asked to also judge photography classes

The guidelines are available from the OHA website Shows tab
 Click on Useful Guides for Show Organizers, Judges & Competitors

• It is based on a 100 point scale as in OJES (2019)

SCALE of POINTS:
Composition35  The arrangement of the centre of interest and all other elements in the photo
Artistic Merit25  An original artistic concept in the choice and organization of all of the components of the photo
Impact 10
Creativity10
Other aspects05
Technical Merit25 The technical aspects include:
Colour 05
Lighting 05
Other aspects15
Presentation

 The guidelines explore each category in more detail through a series of questions

 OHA Districts and Societies should consider revising their photo judging scale of points to these new OHA guidelines

# Recent Questions & Answers

## Question?

What guidance does OHA have for Judges doing Judging during COVID -19?

### **ANSWER:**

Judges must always feel personally comfortable in taking on any Judging assignment

The key during COVID 19 is to check with the **Health** unit for the location of the show and make sure you are in compliance with what the requirements are on the day of the Show

The requirements can change quickly so call the health unit. Do not depend on the Society local news, etc.

Question?

Can I use oiled leaves in a floral design?

### **ANSWER: Yes**

Unless the show schedule prohibits it

OJES 2019 (p.22), *Tips In Preparation of Entries* states: Wiring, oiling, spraying with leaf shine and artificial colouring is prohibited in the **Horticultural Division** 

Note: it does not say in the Design Division, where it is permitted

### QUESTION?

In the Horticultural Division, can faded petals be removed from the back of a Dahlia specimen when showing?

### **ANSWER: Yes**

OJES 2019 (p.63) states that the removal of faded petals from the back of the Dahlia bloom is permitted **but** must not spoil the form.

### Note:

A few may be removed but when you remove too many you've gone too far and spoiled the flower form and will be penalized.)

In the Design Division, you were always allowed to manipulate flower form and structure.
