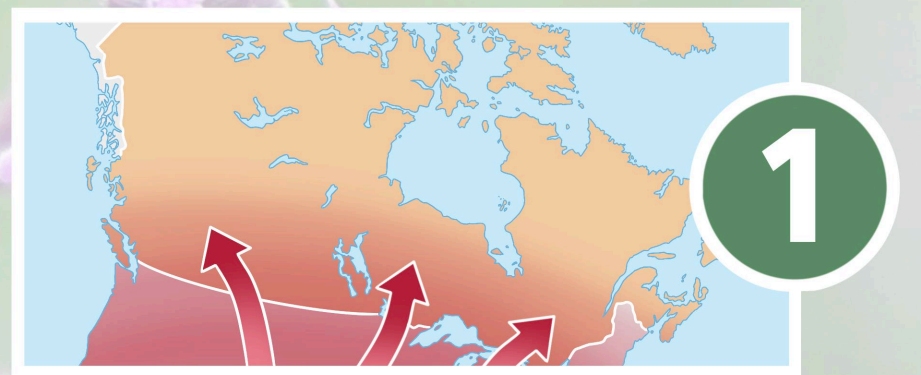


TICKS & CLIMATE CHANGE

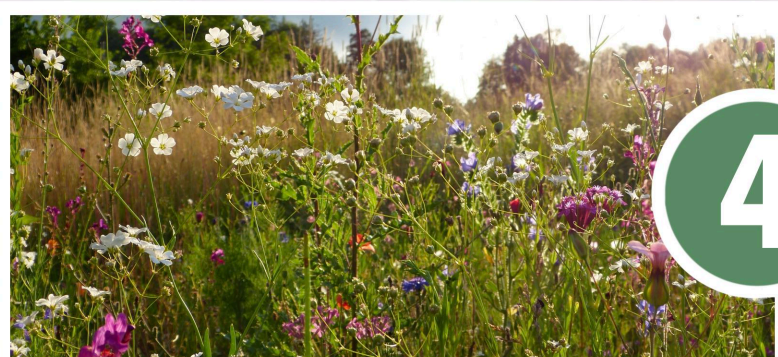


As the climate warms, Ticks are able to thrive farther north. Here's how to protect yourself (and your garden) from this dangerous pest



Skip the Pesticides: Instead of spraying chemicals, try a **mulch moat** - a three-foot barrier containing woodchips, which are typically too hot and dry for ticks to cross

Rewild: Short grass may prevent some ticks, but longer grass welcomes mammals like foxes and opossums, which make short work of ticks



Plant Smart: Choose plants that repel ticks such as rosemary, mint, lemongrass, sage, lavender, garlic, onions, marigold, petunias, and juniper

And Finally, Fight Climate Change! To slow our growing tick epidemic, we need to reduce our reliance on fossil fuels and the many products made with them
